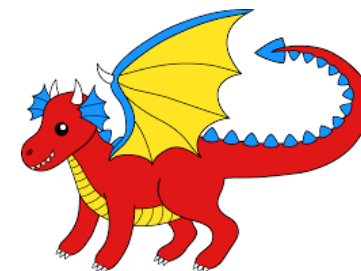
Looking at similarities and differences between themselves and others.

PSHE / Health and well-being

- Discuss what the children would like to do if they were king or queen for the day. Would they like to live in a castle or palace? Would they have knights to fight dragons? Would they hold a big party for all their friends?
- Talk to the children about being brave - like knights. What does being brave mean? When were the children brave? Remind the children that being brave means that they can still ask for help when needed but that they try new things and persevere with challenges.
- Children work in groups to make a castle out of junk modelling or construction.
