

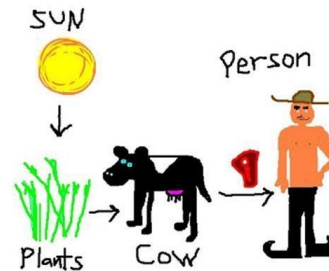
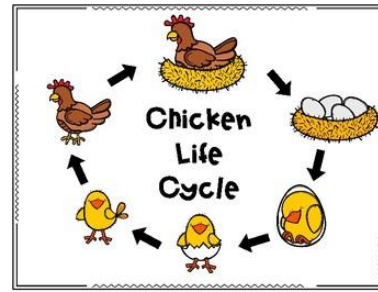

Key Vocabulary

adult	A fully grown animal
develop	To grow and become stronger
life cycle	The things living things go through to become and adult
reproduce	When living things make a new living thing of the same kind
young	Offspring that has not become an adult yet
live young	Offspring that has not hatched from an egg
food chain	Animals get their food from plants and other animals. A food chain shows how energy is passed along.
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants
carnivore	Animals that only eat meat
omnivore	Animals that eat plants and other animals.
mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grown hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
arable	Farms which grow crops
dairy	Farms which milk cows
livestock	Farms which raise animals for meat, wool or eggs
harvest	A process of gathering ripe crops.
seasons	The main periods we divide our year into.
crops	A plant that is harvested. For example; wheat, barley or corn
